**School Town of Speedway – July 9, 2020**

I am excited to announce, in collaboration with the Marion County Health Department, that all Speedway Schools will open on-time, in-person, and 5 days a week beginning August 4, 2020!

Speedway Schools will also offer an E-Learning option for our students that choose not to attend in person. Please note that a student/parent choosing the E-Learning option will need to commit to this decision for the first semester for High School. Elementary and Junior High will need to commit for 9-weeks. Also, please understand the E-Learning curriculum will be limited and cannot mirror the full curriculum and experience of in-person instruction. Choosing the E-Learning option does not allow a student to participate in extracurricular activities. A minimum number of students is required in each grade level to offer this option.

Registration for Speedway Schools is the week of July 13th through July 17th. We have moved to an on-line registration process for students returning to Speedway Schools for the 2020-2021 school year. Please note that decisions about E-Learning need to be made before the end of the day on July 17th. If you choose the E-Learning option, you will need to communicate that decision by calling your child's school before that deadline. It is critical that we have this information by July 17th so we can plan appropriately for your child's instruction.

This pandemic has impacted countless aspects of families' lives and school operations. I am grateful for your understanding and collaboration as we attempt to offer options that best allow education to continue despite the circumstances. I look forward to continuing to work with you to support the children of our community.
